TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE, CH. 32. No. 2

RESOLUTION

PASSED BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL UNDER SECTION 49A OF THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE

Resolved :

That this Council, in accordance with and subject to the provisions of Section 49A of the Customs Ordinance as enacted by the Customs (Amendment) Ordinance, 1959, hereby exempts from import duties of customs the classes of goods specified in the second column of the Appendix hereto, being goods imported or entered for use for the respective purposes specified in the third column of the said Appendix, during the periods terminating not later than the respective dates prescribed in the fourth column of the said Appendix as the last dates on which such exemption shall be operative.
