ORDER

Made by the Commissioner of Police under section 68(1) of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act

THE TRAFFIC RESTRICTION (TEMPORARY PROVISIONS) (ARIMA BOROUGH DAY MILITARY PARADE) ORDER, 2019

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Traffic Restriction (Temporary Citation Provisions) (Arima Borough Day Military Parade) Order, 2019.
- 2. This Order has effect from 8.00 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. on Sunday 4th Duration August, 2019.
 - 3. A driver of a motor vehicle proceeding to Arima—

Vehicular traffic routes

- (a) from the west along the Eastern Main Road, shall turn north onto Industry Street, east onto Anglican Street, north onto King Street, east onto DeGannes Street, south onto Prince Street, east onto El Carmen Street, east along Columbus Street to Moreno Street, east onto Guanapo Street and then onto the Eastern Main Road;
- (b) from the east along Guanapo Street, shall turn south onto Quesnel Street, continuing west and then south onto Pro Queen Street;
- (c) from the west along Guanapo Street, shall turn north onto Thano Street, west onto Columbus Street, north onto Prince Street, west onto De Gannes Street, south onto King Street, west onto Anglican Street, south onto Industry Street and west onto the Eastern Main Road; and
- (d) from the south along Cocorite Street, west onto Quesnel Street, then onto Pro Queen Street, west onto Robinson Circular, north onto Queen Mary Avenue and west onto the Eastern Main Road.
- 4. A driver of a maxi-taxi proceeding east along the Priority Bus Priority Bus Route to Arima shall turn north onto Railway Road, north onto Route maxi-taxis Anglican Street, north onto King Street, east onto Sanchez Street, south onto St. Joseph Street and onto the Priority Bus Route maxi-taxi stand.

Eastern Main Road maxitaxis 5. A driver of a maxi-taxi proceeding along the Eastern Main Road to Arima shall turn north onto Industry Street, east onto Anglican Street, north onto King Street, east onto Rose Street, north onto St. Joseph Street and then onto the Eastern Main Road maxi-taxi stand.

Priority Bus Route buses 6. A driver of a bus proceeding east along the Priority Bus Route shall turn north onto Railway Road, north onto Queen Mary Avenue, west onto John Shaw Avenue and onto the bus terminus on the southern side of John Shaw Avenue, facing west, in front of the Arima Health Centre.

Bus routes

- 7. A driver of a Public Transport Service Corporation proceeding to—
 - (a) Arima from the east along Guanapo Street, shall turn west onto Quesnel Street, south onto Pro Queen Street, west onto Robinson Circular, north onto Queen Mary Avenue to stop alongside the Arima District Hospital; and
 - (b) Sangre Grande, shall turn north onto Industry Street, east onto Anglican Street, north onto King Street, east onto DeGannes Street, south onto Prince Street, east onto El Carmen Street, then onto Columbus Street, south onto Moreno Street and east onto Guanapo Street.

Taxi stands

- 8. A driver of a taxi shall operate—
 - (a) a Port-of-Spain taxi, from the southern side of Broadway, between St. Joseph Street and King Street, facing west;
 - (b) a Mausica Old Road taxi, from lower King Street, facing north;
 - (c) a Mt. Pleasant taxi, from higher Prince Street, facing north, on the western side, between Sanchez Street and Church Street;
 - (d) a Calvary Hill taxi, from—
 - (i) higher Prince Street, facing north, on the western side, between Sanchez Street and Church Street; and
 - (ii) higher Woodford Street, on the western side, facing north, between Sanchez Street and Church Street;
 - (e) Cumuto and Pinto Road taxi, from—
 - (i) Guanapo Street, facing east, on the northern side; and
 - (ii) Sangre Grande/ Valencia taxi-stand to the southern side in the vicinity of Massy Stores;

- (f) a Cocorite Road and La Horquetta taxi, from Cocorite Road, on the western side, facing south, in the vicinity of Maurice Avenue; and
- (g) a Malabar and Carapo taxi, from Loubon Street, on the southern side, facing west.
- 9. Without prejudice to any other liability incurred by the Removal and commission of a summary offence, vehicles found parked in impounding contravention of this Order may be removed by the Police and unlawfully impounded and dealt with in accordance with section 108(1)(b) of the parked Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act.
