Act No. 18 of 1972

AN ACT to amend the Firearms Act, 1970.

[Assented to 28th April, 1972]

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by **Enactment** and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Firearms (Amendment) **Short title** Act, 1972.

2. Section 6 of the Firearms Act, 1970 (hereinafter referred to as "the act") is amended by adding at the end of subsection (2) thereof the words "or a customs officer acting in his capacity as such while patrolling the territorial sea of Trinidad and Tobago."

Section 7(1)
of the Act
amended

3. Section 7(1) of the Act is amended in paragraph (a) thereof by inserting between the words "such" and "if" occurring in line six, the words "or a prison officer acting in his capacity as such, or a customs officer acting in his capacity as such,".

Section 39
of the Act
amended

4. Section 39 of the Act is amended—

(a) by repealing and replacing subsection (1) thereof, as follows:—

"Appropriate
fee."

39. (1) The Governor-General may prescribe fees (herein called the "appropriate fee") for the purposes of subsection (4) and section 17(5), and different fees may be prescribed for different classes of holders of licences, certificates or permits or for different types of firearms.

(2) Subject to subsection (4), the holder of a Firearm User's Licence that includes more than one firearm shall pay the appropriate fee for each firearm included in the licence.";

(b) by renumbering subsections (2) and (3) as subsections (3) and (4) respectively.

Commencement

5. This Act is deemed to have come into operation on 1st January, 1971.
