AN ORDINANCE to amend the Fishing Industry (Assistance)
Ordinance, 1955.

[27th March, 1958.]

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the
advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Enactment.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Fishing Industry
(Assistance) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1958, and shall be read
as one with the Fishing Industry (Assistance) Ordinance, here-
inafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Short title.

Section 2 of
Principal Ordinance amended.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended—

- (a) by deleting the definition "Director";
(b) by inserting the following definition immediately after the definition "engine"—

" "Fisheries Officer" means the person for the time being holding the office of Fishery Officer and includes any officer of the Department of Fisheries authorised by him to act on his behalf;" and

- (c) by substituting for the word "Agriculture" occurring in the third line of the definition "Minister" the word "Fisheries".

Section 7 of
Principal Ordinance amended

3. Section 7 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended—

- (a) by substituting the words "Department of Fisheries" for the words "Department of Agriculture" occurring in the third line thereof; and
(b) by substituting the words "Fisheries Officer" for the word "Director" occurring in the last line thereof.

Consequential amendments.

4. The amendments specified in the second column of the Schedule to this Ordinance which relate to consequential matters shall respectively be made in the sections of the Principal Ordinance specified in the first column of the said Schedule.

SCHEDULE

Section	Amendment
3 (1), 5 (1) (i), 8 and 9	The words "Fisheries Officer" shall be substituted for the word "Director" wherever it occurs.
