THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS, 2026

ORDER

MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HOMELAND SECURITY IN ACCORDANCE
WITH PARAGRAPH 2 OF THE SCHEDULE TO THE EMERGENCY POWERS
REGULATIONS, 2026

DETENTION ORDER

WHEREAS it is enacted by regulation 14 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2026, that the provisions of the Schedule shall have effect for the purpose of the preventive detention of persons:

And whereas it is provided in paragraph 2 of the Schedule of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2026, that the Minister may, if satisfied with respect to any person that, with a view to preventing her from acting in any manner prejudicial to public safety and that it is necessary to provide for her preventive detention, make an order that she be detained and stating concisely the grounds for such detention:

And whereas it is further provided in paragraph 3(1) of the Schedule of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2026, that any person in respect of whom a detention order is in force may be arrested without warrant by any police officer and may be detained in such place and under such conditions as the Minister may from time to time direct:

And whereas I, the Honourable Roger Alexander, Minister of Homeland Security, am satisfied with respect to TYNESHA MANORAM of Upper Davis Street, Belmont, that it is necessary to provide for her preventive detention with a view to preventing her from acting in a manner prejudicial to public safety:

Now, therefore, I, the Honourable Roger Alexander, Minister of Homeland Security, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me, do hereby order that the said TYNESHA MANORAM of Upper Davis Street, Belmont, shall be detained at the Women's Prison, Golden Grove, Arouca, or such other place as I may from time to time direct as the

place where the said TYNESHA MANORAM of Upper Davis Street, Belmont, shall be detained and so kept in lawful custody.

TAKE NOTICE that the grounds upon which this detention order is made are as follows:

The detainee, TYNESHA MANORAM has been credibly identified as a leader of an Organised Crime Group ('OCG') within the definition of the Anti-Gang Act, 2021, known as the "Davis Street/9 Gang". The OCG has access to a cache of high-powered firearms and ammunition and is engaged in armed robberies, extortion, armed and violent home invasions, shootings, multiple homicides and larceny. The detainee holds a leadership position and is a firearm stash person of the OCG. The detainee and the OCG have been recently identified by confidential intelligence as being involved in an escalating gang conflict with a rival gang leading to attacks and retaliatory shootings in public spaces using high-powered firearms. The detainee and others intend to imminently escalate these attacks using high-powered firearms on their rivals in public spaces and continued participation in organised criminal activity.

A Preventive Detention Order pursuant to regulation 14 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2026, is necessary to disrupt these plans and prevent her from acting in a manner prejudicial to public safety.
