THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS, 2026

ORDER

MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HOMELAND SECURITY IN ACCORDANCE
WITH PARAGRAPH 2 OF THE SCHEDULE TO THE EMERGENCY POWERS
REGULATIONS, 2026

DETENTION ORDER

WHEREAS it is enacted by regulation 14 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2026, that the provisions of the Schedule shall have effect for the purpose of the preventive detention of persons:

And whereas it is provided in paragraph 2 of the Schedule of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2026, that the Minister may, if satisfied with respect to any person that, with a view to preventing him from acting in any manner prejudicial to public safety and that it is necessary to provide for his preventive detention, make an order that he be detained and stating concisely the grounds for such detention:

And whereas it is further provided in paragraph 3(1) of the Schedule of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2026, that any person in respect of whom a detention order is in force may be arrested without warrant by any police officer and may be detained in such place and under such conditions as the Minister may from time to time direct:

And whereas I, the Honourable Roger Alexander, Minister of Homeland Security, am satisfied with respect to to AKINI JOSEPH also known as “MUNDO” of No. 1 Rig Road, Claxton Bay that it is necessary to provide for his preventive detention with a view to preventing him from acting in a manner prejudicial to public safety:

Now, therefore, I, the Honourable Roger Alexander, Minister of Homeland Security, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me, do hereby order that the said AKINI JOSEPH also known as “MUNDO” of No. 1 Rig Road, Claxton Bay, shall be detained at the Eastern Correctional Rehabilitation Centre located at Santa Rosa, Arima, or

such other place as I may from time to time direct, as the place where the said AKINI JOSEPH also known as “MUNDO” of No. 1 Rig Road, Claxton Bay, shall be detained and so kept in lawful custody.

TAKE NOTICE that the grounds upon which this detention order is made are as follows:

The detainee, AKINI JOSEPH also known as “MUNDO” has been credibly identified through confidential intelligence as a member of an informal crime group (‘ICG’). The ICG has confirmed access to firearms and ammunition. Confidential intelligence indicates that the detainee and others are engaged in the breaking into of commercial premises to remove valuable brass valves, tools, and other materials, and the subsequent disposal of those items through the scrap metal trade. The detainee, during a recent search at his property, issued threats to named members of the Trinidad and Tobago Police Service and has been linked to recent reports of possession of a firearm. The detainee has been credibly linked to the disposal of the stolen items *via* his scrap metal business and he and others intend to imminently escalate these attacks on commercial premises.

A Preventive Detention Order pursuant to regulation 14 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2026, is necessary to disrupt these plans and prevent him from acting in a manner prejudicial to public safety.
