AN ORDINANCE to provide for the service of the Colony
for the year ending on the 31st December, 1951.

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Enactment.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Appropriation Ordinance, 1951, and shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st January, 1951.

2. A sum not exceeding sixty million six hundred and thirty-five thousand one hundred and twenty-five dollars, and the same hereby is, charged upon the revenue and other funds of the Colony for the service of the year ending on the 31st December, 1951, and the same shall be expended in the manner hereinafter described and in conformity with the Schedules to this Ordinance.

3. The Accountant General may, on the warrant of the Governor, pay out of the revenue and other funds of the Colony during the year ending on the 31st December, 1951, any sum not exceeding in the whole the sum of fifty-four million eight hundred and eighty-two thousand seven hundred and twenty-five dollars set forth in the First Schedule to this Ordinance.

4. The Accountant General may, on the warrant of the Governor, pay out of the revenue of the Trinidad Government Railway and other funds of the Colony during the year ending on the 31st December, 1951, any sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of four million eight hundred and thirteen thousand five hundred and twenty-two dollars set forth in the Second Schedule to this Ordinance: Provided that any balance of such sum unissued at the end of December of that year may be utilised before the accounts of the said period are closed for the discharge of any liability incurred during the said period.

5. The General Manager, Port Services Department, may, on the warrant of the Governor, pay out of the revenue of the Port Services Department and other funds of the Colony during the year ending on the 31st December, 1951, any sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of three million nine hundred and eight thousand eight hundred and eleven dollars set forth in the Third Schedule to this Ordinance: Provided that any balance of such sum unissued at the end of December of that year may be utilised before the accounts of the said period are closed for the discharge of any liability incurred during the said period.
