AN ORDINANCE to amend the Jury Ordinance, Ch. 4. No. 2

[17th June, 1948.]

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Short title.

Construction.

Ch. 4. No. 2.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Jury (Amendment) Ordinance, 1948, and shall be read as one with the Jury Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 7 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following:—

“Members of the air crew of any company, firm or other organisation operating an air-line service under an agreement with the Government who hold licences issued by the Director of Civil Aviation”.

3. Section 31 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and replaced by the following section:—

“Payment
of common
jurors.

31. Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, jurors other than jurors summoned on special juries shall be entitled to be paid, in respect of their travelling to and from and attendance and subsistence at the place to which they are summoned, such sums as the Governor may, by regulations published in the *Royal Gazette*, prescribe, and such regulations may prescribe the payment of or provision of a free pass for any railway fare or steamboat fare going and returning: Provided that no such juror residing three miles or less from the place to which he is summoned or ordinarily carrying on business in such place shall be eligible to receive payment of any sum or a free pass under this section unless he satisfies the Registrar of the Supreme Court or the Sub-Registrar of the Court at San Fernando or Tobago, as the case may be, either by evidence on oath or otherwise that as a result of his having had to serve as a juror he has—

- (a) sustained the loss of his wages or any part thereof, or
- (b) been prevented from pursuing his trade, business, occupation or profession, and has thereby suffered a loss of earnings, for the period of his service as a juror.”
