THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY) REGULATIONS, 1940

ORDER

(MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER REGULATION 8 OF THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY) REGULATIONS, 1940, AND OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF).

THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY (ENEMY TERRITORY CESSATION) (GREECE) ORDER, 1955.

1. This Order may be cited as the Trading with the Enemy (Enemy Territory Cessation) (Greece) Order, 1955.

2. Such parts of Greece as by virtue of Regulation 8 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1940, as enacted by the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) (Amendment No. 2) Regulations, 1943, and as amended by the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) (Amendment) Regulations, 1944, are to be treated as enemy territory for the purposes of sections 5A, 6, 7 and 9 of the Trading with the Enemy Ordinance, and for the purposes of any order made under the said section 9 shall cease to be so treated as from the date of this Order.

THE ANTIBIOTICS ORDINANCE, CH. 12. No. 8

ORDER

MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL UNDER SECTION 2 OF THE ANTIBIOTICS ORDINANCE

THE ANTIBIOTICS (POLYMYXINS) (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1955

1. This Order may be cited as the Antibiotics (Polymyxins) (Amendment) Order, 1955, and shall be read as one with the Antibiotics (Polymyxins) Order, 1955, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order:

2. Paragraph 2 of the Principal Order is hereby amended by the insertion, immediately after the word "Polymyxins" in the last line, of the words "other than Aerosporin Otic Solution and Polyfax Ointment".
