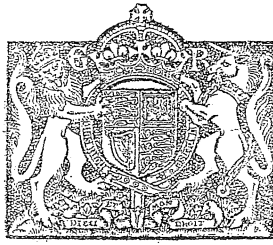

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Land Acquisition
Ordinance, No. 14 of 1941.

Commencement.

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof.

1. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Land Acquisition- Short title.
tion (Amendment) Ordinance, 1943, and shall be read as one Construction and

(2) Sections 3 and 5 of this Ordinance shall be deemed to have come into force immediately after the commencement of the Principal Ordinance and all acts or omissions which would have been lawful if those sections had so come into force shall be deemed to have been lawfully done or omitted.

2. Subsection (1) of section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended—

(a) by deleting the following words—

“ Director ” means the “ Director of Works and Transport ; ” ;

(b) by substituting a semicolon for the full stop appearing at the end of the definition of “ Registrar ” ;

(c) by adding the following at the end thereof :—

“ Sub-Intendant ” means the person appointed Sub-Intendant of Crown Lands under section 5 of the Crown Lands Ordinance.

3. Section 6 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended—

(1) by substituting the following subsection for subsection (1) thereof :—

“ (1) As soon as may be after any land has been compulsorily acquired, the Sub-Intendant shall, if the land acquired has not been marked out cause the same to be marked out, and shall also, before taking exclusive possession of the land, cause a notice or notices in accordance with subsection (2) of this section to be served, either personally on, or by post addressed to the last known place of abode or business (if within a postal delivery district) of, every person who is known or believed by the Sub-Intendant to be entitled to compensation in respect of the acquisition and whose whereabouts are known to the Sub-Intendant: Provided that whenever the whereabouts of any such person are not known, the Sub-Intendant shall cause such notice to be posted conspicuously on the said land ”.

(2) by repealing subsection (4) thereof.

4. (1) The words "Sub-Intendant" shall be substituted for the word "Director" wherever the latter word, in its relation to the Director of Works and Transport, appears in the Principal Ordinance.

"Sub-Intendant" substituted for "Director" throughout the Principal Ordinance and other laws relating to the acquisition of land.

(2) Any law in force in the Colony, relating to the powers of the Director of Works and Transport in respect of the acquisition of land, shall be construed as if for the words "Director of Works and Transport" or "Director" there were substituted the words "Sub-Intendant".

5. Section 31 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting the words "posting and service" where they occur in subsection (2) thereof and substituting therefor the words "service or posting, as the case may be,".

Section 31 of the Principal Ordinance amended.
