ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof. Enactment

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Larceny (Amendment) Ordinance, 1951, and shall be read as one with the Larceny Ordinance. Short title

New section
24A added to

2. The following section is hereby added to the Larceny Ordinance immediately after section 24 :—

'Attempted robbery.

24A. Every person who—

- (a) being armed with any offensive weapon or instrument, or being together with one other person or more, attempts to rob any person,
- (b) attempts to rob any person and, at the time of or immediately before or immediately after such attempted robbery, uses any personal violence to any person,

shall be guilty of felony and liable to imprisonment for fifteen years."

Passed in Council this ninth day of November, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-one.
