AN ORDINANCE to amend the Liquor Licences Ordinance,
Ch. 32. No. 11.

[31st December, 1946.]

E NACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof. Enactment.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Liquor Licences (Amendment) Ordinance, 1946, and shall be read as one with the Liquor Licences Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance. Short title.

2. Section 31 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and replaced by the following :—

“ Spirit
dealers.

31. (1) Save as provided in subsection (2) hereof, a spirit dealer's licence shall be granted in respect of premises situate in Port-of-Spain, San Fernando, and Scarborough only, and only by the Comptroller or the Officer thereunto authorised by the Comptroller.

(2) The Governor in Council may, in his discretion, authorise the Comptroller to issue a spirit dealer's licence in respect of premises situate in any part of the Colony other than the towns specified in subsection (1) hereof.”

3. Subsection (1) of section 38 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting therein the following paragraph immediately after paragraph (b) thereof :—

“(bb) the Director of Civil Aviation, or any person nominated by him, in respect of the sale of intoxicating liquor at any airport in the Colony ;”.
