AN ORDINANCE to amend the Food and Drugs
Ordinance, Cap. 107.

[On Proclamation.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Food and Drugs Short title.
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1933, and shall be construed as
one with the Food and Drugs Ordinance, Cap. 107, Construction.
hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and
shall come into operation on such day as may be fixed Commence-
by the Governor by proclamation. ment.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment
amended by deleting the definitions of "Lard" and "Lard of s. 2 of
Substitute" and substituting the following :— Cap. 107.

"Hogs' lard" means the substance made from the pure
fat of swine unmixed with any other oil or fat ;

"Hogs' lard substitute" includes any substance,
compound, or mixture prepared in imitation of
hogs' lard.

3. Section 9 (1) (b) of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting the word "hogs'" before the word "lard" in the first line.

Amendment
of s. 15 of
Cap. 107.

4. Section 15 (1) and the heading thereto are hereby amended by inserting the word "hogs'" before the word "lard."

Amendment
of s. 16 (2) of
Cap. 107.

5. Section 16 (2) of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding the following at the end thereof :

Provided that no person shall be deemed to have committed an offence against this section in respect of the sale of pure coconut oil (whether deodorized or not) unmixed with any other substance.
