AN ORDINANCE to amend the Petty Civil Courts  
Ordinance, 1911.

[*1st January, 1923.*]

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago  
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council  
thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Petty Civil Courts Short title.  
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1922, and shall be read as one Construction.  
with the Petty Civil Courts Ordinance, 1911, hereinafter (9-1911.)  
called the Principal Ordinance.

2. The following section shall be inserted as section 30 Affidavits.  
of the Principal Ordinance :—

30. All affidavits for use in a Court may be sworn to  
either before a Commissioner of Affidavits or  
before the Judge or before a Clerk.

Repeal of s. 5

3. Section 5 of the Petty Civil Courts Ordinance, 1921, is hereby repealed.

Judge may  
suspend  
payment of  
fees.

4. Section 58 of the Principal Ordinance shall be read with the addition of the following proviso:—

Provided that any Judge shall have power in any proceeding in which good cause appears to him for so doing, either to remit any fees payable therein or to suspend payment of any fees until the conclusion of such proceeding, in which case he may then direct such fees to be paid as costs by any party to the proceeding by whom he has power to order costs to be paid.

5. This Ordinance shall commence on the 1st day of January, 1923.
