AN ORDINANCE to amend the Maintenance orders (facilities for enforcement) Ordinance, 1921.

[8th November, 1921.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Maintenance Short title. orders (facilities for enforcement) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1921, and shall be read as one with the Maintenance orders (facilities for enforcement) Ordinance, 1921, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance.

2. In section 2 of the Principal Ordinance, in lieu of the Definition of words— “dependants.”

“and the expression ‘dependants’ means such
“persons as that person is, according to the
“law in force in England or Ireland liable to
“maintain”

shall be read the words

“ the expression ‘ dependants ’ means such persons
 “ as that person is liable to maintain under the
 “ law in force in England, Ireland or this
 “ Colony as the case may be, according as the
 “ maintenance order was made in England,
 “ Ireland or this Colony.”

Extension of
 Ordinance to
 other Colonies.

3. The following shall be inserted as section 11a of the Principal Ordinance :

11a. Where the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of any British possession or any territory under His Majesty's protection for the enforcement within such possession or territory of maintenance orders made by a court in this Colony, the Governor may by proclamation extend this Ordinance to maintenance orders made by a court within such possession or territory, and thereupon this Ordinance shall apply to such maintenance orders as if they had been made in England or Ireland.

Passed in Council, this twenty-eighth day of October, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.
