1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Provident Fund Short title.
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1946, and shall be read as one with
the Provident Fund Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Ch. 9. No. 9.

Provision for
payment of
pensions to
dependants of
deceased
depositor
after dying
while in the
service of the
Government.

2. (1) The provisions of section 18 of the Pensions Ordinance (as enacted by section 8 of the Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1943), shall, subject to the limitations hereinafter contained, apply to the case of a depositor dying as a result, and within six months, of any injury received in the actual discharge of his duty and without his own default as though he had held a non-pensionable office in the service of the Government of the Colony.

(2) In the application of the provisions of subsection (1) of section 18 of the said Ordinance to any such case, reference to the gratuity payable under section 17 of the said Ordinance shall be deemed to be a reference to the gratuity payable under section 21 of the Principal Ordinance.

(3) If any pension is awarded under the authority of this Ordinance, full bonus shall not be payable to the nominee or legal personal representative of the deceased depositor as contemplated by subsection (2) of section 20 of the Principal Ordinance.

(4) Such pensions as are provided for under this Ordinance shall be payable only if the award thereof would, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, be more advantageous to the dependants of the deceased depositor than the payment of full bonus.

Retrospective
operation.

3. This Ordinance shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 31st January, 1946.
