AN ORDINANCE to amend the Promissory Oaths Ordinance, Ch. 7. No. 11.

[3rd May, 1956.]

Commencement.

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the Enactment advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Promissory Oaths Short title. (Amendment) Ordinance, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Promissory Oaths Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Ch. 7. No. 11. Principal Ordinance.

2. The following section is hereby substituted for section 5 of the Principal Ordinance: —

"Oath of Executive Councillor.

No. 10.

5. The oath in this Ordinance referred to as the oath of an Executive Councillor shall be in the form following, that is to say:—

I,

being chosen and admitted of Her Majesty's Executive Council in the Colony of Trinidad and Tobago, do swear that I will, to the best of my judgment at all times when thereto required, freely give my counsel and advice to the Governor for the good management of the public affairs of the Colony; that, except with the authority of the Governor, I will not directly or indirectly reveal the business or proceedings of the Executive Council or the nature or contents of any document communicated to me as a member of the said Council or any other matter coming to my knowledge in my capacity as a member of the said Council, and that in all things I will be a true and faithful Councillor. So help me God."

Passed in Council this sixth day of April, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-six.
