AN ORDINANCE to amend the Rural Pedlars'
Ordinance, 1933.

[31st December, 1940.]

Commencement.

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Rural Pedlars' Short title.
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1940, and shall be construed as one Construction.
with the Rural Pedlars' Ordinance, 1933, hereinafter No. 26—1933.
referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Section 3 of
the Principal

2. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and replaced by the following—

Pedlars to
be licensed.

3. No person shall after the commencement of this Ordinance carry on the business of a pedlar unless he holds a licence (in this Ordinance referred to as a pedlar's licence) for the time being in force authorising him so to do, and no holder of such licence shall use a pack animal or any vehicle for the transport of goods unless he shall have first paid the appropriate fee as set forth in the 2nd Part of the Schedule to the Regulations made under the provisions of this Ordinance.

3. Section 6 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting therein the words "the Inspector-General" and substituting therefor the words "a Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police in charge of a division".

Section 7 of
Principal
Ordinance
amended.

4. Section 7 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended—

(a) by deleting therein the words "The Inspector-General" and substituting therefor the words "A Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police in charge of a division"; and

(b) by substituting the words "Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police" for "Inspector-General" in the marginal note thereof.
