AN ORDINANCE to amend the Sale of Produce Ordinance, Cap. 273.

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.  
Construction.  
Cap. 273.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Sale of Produce (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934, and shall be construed as one with the Sale of Produce Ordinance, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance.

2. In sub-section (2) of section 19 of the Principal Ordinance, for the word "kept" there shall be read the word "keep".

3. The Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition of the following new section as Section 43 :

43.—(1) Except as hereinafter provided nothing in this Ordinance shall apply to the sale or delivery by the owner, manager or tenant of a plantation or by the contractor on any plantation if authorized in writing by the owner or manager thereof, of uncured cocoa to a Government Cocoa Fermentary nor to the sale or other disposal of uncured or cured cocoa by the Manager of a Government Cocoa Fermentary. Saving as to sale or delivery of uncured cocoa to a Government Fermentary.

(2) The authorization in writing by an owner or manager to a contractor shall contain details and particulars of and shall be delivered with the uncured cocoa to which it refers, to the Manager of a Government Cocoa Fermentary.

(3) The Manager of a Government Cocoa Fermentary shall keep such books and issue such receipts as the Director of Agriculture shall determine may be necessary for the purpose of recording the amount of uncured cocoa so received and for identifying the owner, tenant or contractor, as the case may be, who delivers the cocoa and the plantation upon which it was grown.
