AN ORDINANCE to amend the Spirits and Spirit
Compounds Ordinance, 1933.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Spirits and Spirit Short title.
Compounds (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934, and shall be
construed as one with the Spirits and Spirit Compounds No. 30 of 1933.
Ordinance, 1933, hereinafter referred to as the Principal
Ordinance.

2. Section 15 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment
amended by inserting at the commencement thereof, the of s. 15 of
words "Save as is hereinafter contained in section 17", Principal
Ordinance.

Restrictions on
retailers of
spirits being
distillers.

3. Section 17 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following section is substituted therefor :—

17. (1) Except with the written permission of the Governor in Executive Council and subject to such conditions as may be contained in such permission, no retailer of spirits shall be a distiller, or have any part or share in any distillery, or be in any manner interested or concerned in the trade or business of a distiller.

(2) Any such permission may be revoked or the conditions contained therein be varied or altered at any time in the discretion of the Governor in Executive Council, and if any retailer contravenes the provisions of this section or fails to observe or perform the conditions contained in any such permission he shall for every such contravention or failure incur a penalty of one hundred pounds.

Passed in Council this ninth day of March, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.
