AN ORDINANCE to amend the Truck Ordinance, Cap. 156.

Commencement.

[31st December, 1940.]

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Short title Construction. Cap 156.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Truck (Amendment) Ordinance, 1940 and shall be construed as one with the Truck Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 11A of the Principal Ordinance as amended by the Truck (Amendment) Ordinance, 1937, is repealed and the following section is substituted therefor :—

Section 11A of the Principal Ordinance repealed and replaced.

11A. (1) The Governor in Council, if satisfied that all or any of the provisions of this Ordinance are unnecessary for the protection of the labourers employed in any trade or business, or in any branch or department of any trade or business, either generally or within any specified area, or of the labourers employed by any specified employer in any specified trade or business, or in any branch or department of any such trade or business, either generally or within any specified area, may by order under his hand grant an exemption from those provisions in respect of the labourers engaged in any such specified trade, business, branch or department, either generally or within any such specified area, as the case may be, or of the labourers employed by such specified employer in such specified trade, business, branch or department, either generally or within any such specified area, as the case may be. Such order may be made subject to such terms and conditions, to be specified therein as the Governor in Council may think fit to impose.

Exemption from provisions of Ordinance for protection of labourers.

(2) The Governor in Council may at any time amend or revoke any such order.

(3) No order made under this section shall have any force or effect until it has been approved by resolution of the Legislative Council.
