AN ORDINANCE to amend the Post Office Ordinance.
Cap. 108.

[26th March, 1931.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

Short title

Construction.

Licence to use
postal

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Post Office (Amendment) Ordinance, 1931, and shall be read as one with the Post Office Ordinance, Cap. 108, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance.

2. The following section shall be inserted as section 13A of the Principal Ordinance :—

13A. (1) The Postmaster-General may grant licences to use postal franking machines in the Colony on such terms and conditions (including the payment of fees) as may be set out in the licence.

(2) The Postmaster-General may cancel a licence granted under this section if any of the terms and conditions thereof or if any regulation made under this Ordinance in relation to postal franking machines is contravened.

(3) Any person using a postal franking machine without having a licence in force therefor shall be guilty of an offence, and on summary conviction thereof before a magistrate shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds, and in case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of twenty pounds for each day during which the offence continues.
