AN ORDINANCE to amend the Post Office Ordinance,
Ch. 36. No. 1.

[24th December, 1942.]

Commencement.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Post Office Short title.
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1942.

2. The Post Office Ordinance is hereby amended by New section
added to the
Post Office
Ordinance,
Ch. 36. No. 1.
inserting, immediately after section 14 thereof, the
following new section :

Power to
authorise col-
lection and
delivery of
postal packets
otherwise
than by post.

14A. The Postmaster General, with the
consent of the Governor in Council, may, either
generally or in the case of any particular person,
authorise—

- (a) letters or other postal packets to be sent,
conveyed, and delivered otherwise than
by post; and
- (b) the collection otherwise than by an officer
of the Post Office of any letters or other
postal packets, whether to be so sent or to
be sent by post,

but the authority shall be subject in every case
to such provisions, conditions, prohibitions, and
restrictions as are specified in regulations made
under this Ordinance.
