AN ORDINANCE to amend the Trade Marks (Enemy Marks) Ordinance, 1917.

[23rd November, 1917.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Trade Marks Short Title.
(Enemy Marks) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1917.

2. Section 3 of the Trade Marks (Enemy Marks) Ordinance 1917 is hereby repealed and the following section shall be inserted in lieu thereof:— Repeal of Section 3 of Ordinance 15 of 1917.

3.—(1.) All enemy business marks shall be vested in and become the property of the Custodian of



Enemy Property appointed under Section 3 of the Trading with the Enemy (Consolidation) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1916.

(2.) Any goodwill of a business existing by reason of the use within the Colony of any such mark shall also be vested in the said Custodian.
