AN ORDINANCE to amend the Summary Conviction Offences Ordinance, Cap. 25.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title. 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Summary
Construction. Conviction Offences (Amendment) Ordinance, 1937, and
Cap. 25. shall be construed as one with the Summary Conviction
Offences Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal
Ordinance.

Amendment of 2. Sub-Section (1) of Section 67 of the Principal
Sec. 67 (1) of Ordinance. Ordinance is hereby amended by substituting the word
the Principal "three" for the word "two".

Addition of 3. The following Section shall be included in the
Sec. 113 to the Principal Ordinance as Section 113:

Penalty provided in respect of publications which do not contain names of printer and publisher thereof.

113. Every person who prints or publishes any publication (which term shall include any book, circular, pamphlet, hand-bill, poster or any other publication whether printed, type-written, or written) shall cause to be printed, type-written or written thereon (as the case may be), in some conspicuous place and in legible characters the names and addresses of the printer and publisher

thereof. Every person who fails to comply with the provisions of this section and every person who shall circulate or cause to be circulated any publication which contravenes the provisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding Ninety-six Dollars or to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding six months.
