1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Summary Offences Short title.
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1945.

2. The Summary Offences Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition of the following sections:—

“Control of
music in
public places.

70A. No person shall, except during the Carnival, without licence under the hand of a police officer not below the rank of a non-commissioned officer in charge of a police station beat any drum or play any noisy instrument in any street or public place, and any person contravening the provisions of this section shall be liable to a fine of twenty-four dollars.

Power to
suspend opera-
tion of section
70A.

70B. The Governor in Council may, by proclamation suspend the operation of the preceding section, during any period specified in such proclamation.”
