AN ORDINANCE to amend the Summary Conviction
Offences (Procedure) Ordinance, 1918.

[26th March, 1923.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Summary Short title.
Conviction Offences (Procedure) (Amendment) Ordinance, Construction.
1923, and shall be read as one with the Summary Conviction
Offences (Procedure) Ordinance, 1918, hereinafter called (9-1918).

2. Sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Principal Ordinance Appointment
is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof shall be read the of Magistrates
following :— and Acting
Magistrates.

(1) His Majesty may from time to time, by warrant
under the hand of the Governor and the
seal of the Colony, appoint Magistrates; and

in case of the death, retirement, suspension or removal from office, absence on leave or on special duty, or unavoidable absence of any Magistrate, or whenever in the opinion of the Governor the due administration of justice in any district so requires, may in like manner appoint some other person to act as a Magistrate for such period as may be specified in the warrant.

Execution of

3. The following shall be read at the end of section 81 of the Principal Ordinance:

“Any warrant of commitment issued under the provisions of this section may be executed on a Sunday.”

Repeal.

4. Sub-section (2) of section 15 and section 136 of the Principal Ordinance are hereby repealed.
