AN ORDINANCE to provide that the Crown Law Officers  
be entitled to practise in the Courts of the Colony.

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago  
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council  
thereof as follows :

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Law Officers Short title.  
Ordinance, 1936.

2. Any person holding any of the offices designated in Law Officers  
entitled to  
practise as  
Barristers.  
Part I of the Schedule hereto shall, so long as he  
continues to hold such office, have and enjoy all the rights  
and privileges of a barrister entitled to practise in the  
Colony.

3. Any person holding any of the offices designated in Crown  
Solicitor and  
his assistant to  
be Solicitors of  
the Supreme  
Court.  
Part II of the Schedule hereto shall, so long as he  
continues to hold such office, have and enjoy all the rights  
and privileges of a solicitor of the Supreme Court, duly  
enrolled and admitted, without being required to pay any  
stamp duty or licence fee.
