AN ORDINANCE to amend the Dogs Ordinance, 1918.

[*1st January, 1923.*]

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Dogs (Amendment) Short title. Ordinance, 1922, and shall be read as one with the Dogs Construction. Ordinance, 1918, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance. (14-1918.)

2. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, Licences. and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:—

3.—(1) No person shall keep a dog above the age of three months unless such person shall, for each dog which he may have or keep, obtain a yearly licence

(a) In the City of Port-of-Spain, from the Inspector-General of Constabulary;

- (b) In the Borough of San Fernando, from the Warden of the County of Victoria;
- (c) In the Borough of Arima, from the Warden of the County of St. George;
- (d) In any other part of the Colony, from the Warden of the district;

for which licence shall be paid the sum of twelve shillings and six-pence in the City of Port-of-Spain and the Boroughs of San Fernando and Arima, the sum of eight shillings and four-pence in Princes Town, St. Joseph and Tunapuna, Couva, Sangre Grande and Scarborough as defined respectively for the purposes of Ordinance No. 44 of 1917, and the sum of four shillings and two-pence in any other part of the Colony.

- (2) Every such licence shall expire on the succeeding thirty-first day of December.
- (3) All moneys received in respect of licences granted under this Ordinance shall be paid into the Colonial Treasury.

3. This Ordinance shall commence on the 1st day of January, 1923.
