AN ORDINANCE to amend the Dogs Ordinance,
Ch. 25. No. 4.

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Short title

Ch. 25. No. 4.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Dogs (Amendment) Ordinance, 1951, and shall be read as one with the Dogs Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 6 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) by adding immediately after the word "Police" which occurs in the last line of subsection (1) thereof the words "after being kept for not less than three days in a prescribed place of detention, unless in the opinion of a Veterinary Surgeon or a Police Officer it be in such condition that it ought to be destroyed forthwith.";

(b) by adding immediately after subsection (1) thereof the following new subsection:—

"(1A) Where the owner of any such dog claims the same, such dog shall, unless it has been destroyed as hereinbefore provided, be restored to the owner upon payment by him of the costs and expenses attendant on the detention and delivery of such dog to its owner".
