REPUBLIC OF TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

**Act No. 35 of 1977**

AN ACT for the Incorporation of the Kiwanis Club of  
San Fernando, Trinidad, West Indies and for  
matters incidental thereto.

*[Assented to 25th July, 1977]*

WHEREAS there has been established in the Island of Preamble  
Trinidad and Tobago a Leadership Service Organisa-  
tion known as the Kiwanis Club of San Fernando,  
Trinidad, West Indies :

And whereas it is expedient that the said organisation should be incorporated for the purpose of exercising the powers hereinafter set forth:

**Enactment**

ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows:—

**Short title**

1. This Act may be cited as the *Kiwanis Club of San Fernando, Trinidad, West Indies (Incorporation) Act, 1977*.

**Incorporation**

2. The *Kiwanis Club of San Fernando, Trinidad, West Indies* (hereinafter referred to as "the club") is hereby created a body corporate.

**Aims and  
Objects**

3. The aims and objects of the Club are:—

- (a) to give primacy to the human and spiritual, rather than to the material values of life;
- (b) to encourage the daily living of the Golden Rule in all human relationships;
- (c) to promote the adoption and the application of higher social, business and professional standards;
- (d) to develop, by precept and example, a more intelligent, aggressive, and serviceable citizenship;
- (e) to provide, through this club, a practical means to form enduring friendships, to render altruistic service, and to build a better community;
- (f) to assist in generating public opinion and maintaining idealistic principles in order to encourage a sense of patriotism, goodwill and righteousness and respect for justice.

**Powers of the  
Club**

4. The Club shall have power—

- (a) to acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, devise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance or howsoever otherwise, any real or personal property or any estate or interest therein;
- (b) to accept surrenders or reconveyances and to enter into contracts;
- (c) subject to any restraint, reservation or condition contained in the document

under which it acquired title to sell, demise, mortgage, or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may, for the time being, be vested in it.

5. All documents requiring the seal of the club shall be sealed with the common seal in the presence of its President and Secretary for the time being in office who shall both sign every such document, and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the club.

6. (1) The club shall at all times have a fixed address for the service of documents on the club and that address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General within twenty-eight days of the date of incorporation or the change of address as the case may be.

Service of  
documents of the  
Club

(2) Every document to be served on the club may be served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to the registered address of the club.

(3) Failure to register the address and any change thereof is a summary offence and renders the club liable to a fine of one hundred and twenty dollars and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues after conviction therefor.

7. The club may from time to time make rules and regulations for the proper conduct of its proceedings and discharge of its duties, powers and functions with power to vary or revoke such rules and regulations.
