AN ACT for Incorporation of The Lions Club of Central
Trinidad of Trinidad and Tobago, and for matters
incidental thereto.

[Assented to 6th September, 1973]

WHEREAS for many years there has been established in ^{Preamble}
Chaguanas in Trinidad and Tobago a leadership service
organisation known as the Lions Club of Central Trini-
dad, Trinidad, W.I.:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Club should
be incorporated under the name of The Lions Club of
Central Trinidad of Trinidad and Tobago:

Enactment	BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the authority of the same as follows:—
Short title	1. This Act may be cited as The Lions Club of Central Trinidad of Trinidad and Tobago (Incorporation) Act, 1973.
Incorporation of the Club	2. The Club known as The Lions Club of Central Trinidad of Trinidad and Tobago (hereinafter referred to as the Club) shall be and is hereby created a body corporate and by that name shall have perpetual succession and may sue, and be sued in all courts of Justice in Trinidad and Tobago by that name and shall have and use a common seal with power from time to time to change such seal.
Aims and objects of the Club	<p>3. The aims and objects of the Club are:—</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) To create and foster a spirit of generous consideration among the peoples of the world through a study of the problems of international relationships. (b) To promote the theory and practice of the principles of good government and good citizenship. (c) To take an active part in the civic, social and moral welfare of the community. (d) To unite the members in the bonds of friendship, good fellowship, and mutual understanding. (e) To provide a forum for the full and free discussion of all matters of public interest, partisan politics and sectarian religion alone excepted. (f) To encourage efficiency and promote high ethical standards in business and professions; provided that no club shall hold out as one of its objects financial benefits to its members.

4. The Club shall have power : —Powers of
the Club

- (a) to acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, demise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance or howsoever otherwise, any real or personal property or any estate or interest therein;
- (b) to accept surrenders or reconveyances and to enter into contracts;
- (c) subject to any restraint, reservation or condition contained in the document under which it shall have acquired title thereto, to sell, exchange, demise, mortgage, or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may for the time being be vested in or have been acquired by it; and
- (d) to do all such things that may be appropriate to its aims and objects.

5. All real or personal property of whatever nature now held by or vested in any person for the use and benefit of the Club is hereby transferred to and vested in the Club.

6. All documents requiring the seal of the Club shall be sealed with the common seal in the presence of at least two officers of the Club who shall both sign every such document and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the Club.

7. The Club shall at all times have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on the Club and such address shall be registered with the Registrar General. All documents to be served on the Club may be served by leaving same at, or by sending the same by registered post to, the address so registered.

8. Nothing in this Act shall affect the rights of Her Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors or any bodies politic or corporate or of any other persons except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
