REPUBLIC OF TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

Act No. 34 of 1981

**AN ACT for the Incorporation of the Kiwanis Club of
St. Augustine, Trinidad, West Indies, and for
matters incidental thereto.**

[Assented to 7th September, 1981]

WHEREAS since 1975 there has been established in Preamble
Port-of-Spain, Trinidad, West Indies a community
service organization known as the "Kiwanis Club of
St. Augustine":

And whereas it is expedient that the organization should be incorporated for the purpose of exercising the powers hereinafter set forth:

Enactment

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows:—

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Kiwanis Club of St. Augustine, Trinidad, West Indies (Incorporation) Act, 1981.

Incorporation of the Club

2. The organization known as the Kiwanis Club of St. Augustine (hereinafter called "the Club") is hereby created a body corporate.

Aims and objects of the Club

3. The aims and objects of the Club are:

- (a) to give primacy to the human and spiritual rather than to the material values of life;
- (b) to encourage the daily living of the Golden Rule in all human relationships;
- (c) to promote the adoption and the application of higher social, business, and professional standards;
- (d) to develop, by precept and example, a more intelligent, aggressive and serviceable citizenship;
- (e) to provide through the Club, a practical means to form enduring friendships, to render altruistic service, and to build a better community;
- (f) to co-operate in creating and maintaining that sound public opinion and high idealism which make possible the increase of righteousness, justice, patriotism, and goodwill;
- (g) to do all such things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of its aims and objects.

4. All real or personal property of whatever nature ^{Vesting of property} now held by or vested in any person for the use and benefit of the Club, is hereby transferred to and vested in the Club.

5. All documents requiring the seal of the said Club ^{Mode of execution of documents} shall be sealed with the common seal in the presence of the President and Secretary for the time being in Office (or in the event of incapacity, by some other persons authorised for that purpose by the club) who shall both sign every such document and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the club.

6. (1) The club shall at all times have a fixed address ^{Service of documents on the Club} in Trinidad for the service of documents on the club and that address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General within twenty-eight days of the date of incorporation or the change of address as the case may be.

(2) Every document to be served on the club may be served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to, the registered address of the club.

(3) Failure to register the address and any change thereof is a summary offence and renders the club liable to a fine of one hundred and twenty dollars and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues after conviction thereof.

7. The club may from time to time make rules and ^{Power to make rules} regulations for the proper conduct of its proceedings and discharge of its duties, powers and functions with power to vary or revoke such rules and regulations.

8. Nothing in this Act shall affect the rights of the ^{Saving of State or other rights} State or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any other persons except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from, or under them.
