Act No. 19 of 1982

AN ACT for the Incorporation of the Trinidad and
Tobago Pentecostal Assembly at Diamond Village,
San Fernando, Trinidad, West Indies.

[Assented to 11th August, 1982]

WHEREAS there has been established in Trinidad and Tobago a Religious body known as the Trinidad and Tobago Pentecostal Assembly (hereinafter referred to as "the Assembly"). Preamble

And whereas the Assembly has been incorporated under the Companies Ordinance, Ch. 31. No. 1.

And whereas it is now expedient that the Assembly be incorporated by Act of Parliament.

And whereas the Trinidad and Tobago Pentecostal Assembly has caused to be established a regularly constituted body in Trinidad and Tobago with officers duly elected periodically in accordance with its Constitution.

Enactment BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows:—

Short title 1. This Act may be cited as The Trinidad and Tobago Pentecostal Assembly (Incorporation) Act, 1982.

Incorporation 2. The Trinidad and Tobago Pentecostal Assembly is hereby created a body corporate.

Aims and objects

3. The aims and objects of the Assembly are:—

- (a) to propogate the Gospel;
- (b) to advance God's Kingdom among man;
- (c) to facilitate the spread and advancement of scriptual holiness and the general welfare of all mankind;
- (d) to foster benevolent charitable and educational institutions; and
- (e) to establish indigenou churches;

Execution of documents

4. (1) A document requiring the Seal of the Assembly is not lawfully sealed unless it is:—

- (a) sealed with the common seal of the Assembly;
- (b) sealed in the presence of two members of the general board, and
- (c) signed by the two members.

(2) The signing of a document in accordance with subsection 1(c) is *prima facie* evidence that the seal:

- (a) is the lawful seal of the Assembly, and
- (b) has been duly affixed.

5. (1) The Assembly shall at all times have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on the Assembly and such address shall be registered with the Registrar General's Office within twenty-eight days of the date of incorporation, or the change of address as the case may be.

Vesting of
property

(2) All documents to be served on the Assembly may be served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to the address so registered.

(3) Failure to register the address and any change thereof is a summary offence and renders the Assembly liable to a fine of one hundred and twenty dollars and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues after conviction therefor.

6. The Assembly may make rules for the proper conduct of its proceedings and discharge of its duties and any such rules may varied or revoked, or added from time to time.

make rules

7. Nothing in this Act shall effect or be deemed to effect the rights of the State or of any bodies politic or Corporate or of any other persons except such as are mentioned in this Act and those claiming by from or under them.

5. (1) The Assembly shall at all times have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on the Assembly and such address shall be registered with the Registrar General's Office within twenty-eight days of the date of incorporation, or the change of address as the case may be.

(2) All documents to be served on the Assembly may be served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to the address so registered.

(3) Failure to register the address and any change thereof is a summary offence and renders the Assembly liable to a fine of one hundred and twenty dollars and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues after conviction therefor.

6. The Assembly may make rules for the proper conduct of its proceedings and discharge of its duties and any such rules may varied or revoked, or added from time to time.

7. Nothing in this Act shall effect or be deemed to effect the rights of the State or of any bodies politic or Corporate or of any other persons except such as are mentioned in this Act and those claiming by from or under them.
