**AN ACT for the Incorporation of the Lions Club of
Port-of-Spain Central of Trinidad, West Indies, and
for matters incidental thereto.**

[Assented to 15th August, 1980]

**WHEREAS since 1962 there has been established in Preamble
Port-of-Spain Central in Trinidad and Tobago a
community service organization known as the "Lions
Club of Port-of-Spain Central, Trinidad, West Indies",**

And whereas it is expedient that the said organization should be incorporated under the name of the Lions Club of Port-of-Spain Central, Trinidad, West Indies, for the purpose of exercising the powers hereinafter set forth:

Enactment **BE IT ENACTED** by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows:

Short title **1. This Act may be cited as the Lions Club of Port-of-Spain Central of Trinidad and Tobago (Incorporation) Act, 1980.**

Incorporation **2. The Lion's Club of Port-of-Spain Central (hereinafter referred to as "the Club") is hereby created a body corporate.**

Aims and Objects **3. The aims and objects of the Club are:**

- (a) To create and foster a spirit of understanding among the peoples of the World;
- (b) To promote the principle of good government and good citizenship;
- (c) To take an active interest in the civic, cultural, social and moral welfare of the community;
- (d) To unite the clubs in the bonds of friendship, good fellowship and manual understanding;
- (e) To provide a forum for the open discussion of all matters of public interest; provided however that partisan politics and sectarian religion shall not be debated by club members;
- (f) To encourage service-minded men to serve their community without personal financial reward and to encourage efficiency and promote high ethical standards in commerce, industry, professions, public works and private endeavours;

- (g) To take over the assets, rights and franchises of the unincorporated club known as the Lions Club of Port-of-Spain Central of Port-of-Spain, Trinidad, West Indies, and its members;
- (h) To do all such things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objectives.

4. All property now held or vested in any person for the use and benefit of the club, is hereby vested in the club. Vesting of property

5. All documents requiring the seal of the said club shall be sealed with the common seal in the presence of the President and Secretary (or in the event of incapacity, by some other person or persons authorised for that purpose by the club) who shall both sign every such document and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the club. Mode of Execution of Documents

6. (1) The club shall at all times have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on the club and such documents, address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General within twenty-eight days of the date of incorporation or the change of address as the case may be. Service of Documents

(2) All documents may be served on the club by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to the registered address of the club.

(3) Failure to register the address and any change thereof is a summary offence and renders the club liable to a fine of one hundred and twenty dollars and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues after conviction therefor.

7. The club may from time to time make rules and regulations for the proper conduct of its proceedings and discharge of its duties, powers and functions with power to vary or revoke such rules and regulations. Corporate body may make rules
