AN ACT to provide for the Service of Trinidad and
Tobago for the year ending on the 31st day of
December, 1997.

[Assented to 31st December, 1996]

ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as Enactment
follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act, Short title
1997.

2. The issue from the Consolidated Fund of the sum of eleven thousand, nine hundred and thirteen million, two hundred and forty-five thousand, six hundred and thirty-two dollars is hereby authorised for meeting expenditure for the service of the year ending 31st December, 1997 under the Heads of Expenditure specified in the Schedule; and the sum specified in the Schedule opposite to a Head is hereby appropriated out of the said sum of eleven thousand, nine hundred and thirteen million, two hundred and forty-five thousand, six hundred and thirty-two dollars for the purpose specified in relation to that Head in the Estimates for the said year.

Commencement

3. This Act shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1997.
