Act No. 23 of 1989

AN ACT for the incorporation of the Paediatric Society of Trinidad and Tobago and for matters incidental thereto.

[Assented to 13th June, 1989]

WHEREAS since 1984 there has been established in the ^{Preamble} Republic of Trinidad and Tobago a voluntary community service organisation known as the Paediatric Society of Trinidad and Tobago.

And whereas it is expedient that the said organisation should be incorporated for the purposes of exercising the powers hereinafter set forth.

Enactment	ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows:—
Short Title	1. This Act may be cited as the Paediatric Society of Trinidad and Tobago (Incorporation) Act, 1989.
Incorporation	2. The Paediatric Society of Trinidad and Tobago (hereinafter called the Society) is hereby created a body corporate.
Aims and objects	3. The aims and objects of the Society are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) to achieve and maintain optimum health care for all children in the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago; (b) to assist in continuing paediatric education for medical personnel throughout Trinidad and Tobago; (c) to foster contact between this Society and similar groups in the Caribbean and elsewhere; and (d) to do all such things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above aims and objects.
Powers of the Society	4. The Society shall have the power— <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) to acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, devise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance, lease or howsoever otherwise any real or personal property or any estate or interest therein; (b) to accept surrenders or reconveyances and to enter into contracts; (c) subject to any restraint, reservation or condition contained in the document under which it has acquired title, to sell, exchange, devise, mortgage or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may for the time being be vested in it.
Transfer or Vesting of property	5. All real or personal property now held by or vested in any person for the use and benefit of the Society is hereby transferred to and vested in the Society.

6. All documents requiring the seal of the Society shall be sealed with the common seal of the Society in the presence of the President and Secretary for the time being in office or in the event of incapacity by some other person authorised for that purpose by the Society, who shall both sign every such document and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the Society.

7. (1) The Society shall at all times have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on it and that address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General within twenty-eight days of the date of the incorporation or the change of address as the case may be.

(2) Every document to be served on the Society may be served by leaving the same at or by sending the same by registered post to the registered address of the Society.

(3) Failure to register the address and any change thereof is a summary offence and renders the Society liable to a fine of one hundred and twenty dollars and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues after conviction therefor.

8. The Society may from time to time make rules and regulations for the proper conduct of its proceedings and discharge of its duties, powers and functions with power to vary or revoke such rules and regulations.

9. Nothing in this Act shall affect the rights of the State or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any persons except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
