1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Gambling (Amend- Short title
ment) Ordinance, 1952 and shall be read as one with the
Gambling Ordinance hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ch. 4. No. 20
Ordinance.

2. Section 15 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following section is substituted therefor:—

“Saving
Clause

15. Nothing in this Ordinance contained shall apply to or prevent any lottery at any bazaar, fancy fair or entertainment held for raising funds for any sporting, religious, educational or charitable purpose or in aid of any institution of a public character or the sale by raffle or lottery of any article in connection with any such bazaar, fancy fair or entertainment, whether the lottery tickets are sold at or prior to the holding thereof; provided always that permission for such lottery or sale shall have been given in writing by the Commissioner of Police or a Superintendent of Police and that any article to be so sold is exposed at the bazaar, fancy fair or entertainment as the case may be; provided further that the Commissioner of Police or Superintendent of Police shall have power to impose all or any of such conditions and terms prescribed by Regulations made hereunder by the Governor in Council as may appear to him to be proper in relation to the said sale by raffle or lottery.”
