AN ORDINANCE to provide for the service of the Colony
for the year ending on the 31st December, 1955.

[1st January, 1955.]

Commencement

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Enactment

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Appropriation Ordinance, 1954, and shall come into force on the 1st January, 1955.

Short title and commencement

2. A sum not exceeding ninety-two million, seven hundred and ninety-five thousand and thirty-one dollars shall be and the same hereby is, charged upon the revenue and other funds of the Colony for the service of the year ending on the 31st December, 1955, and the same shall be expended in the manner hereinafter described and in conformity with the Schedules to this Ordinance.

3. The Accountant General may, on the warrant of the Governor, pay out of the revenue and other funds of the Colony during the year ending on the 31st December, 1955, any sum not exceeding in the whole the sum of eighty-five million seven hundred and ninety-five thousand six hundred and seventy-nine dollars set forth in the First Schedule to this Ordinance.

4. The General Manager, Railways and Telegraphs Department may, on the warrant of the Governor pay out of the revenue of the Trinidad Government Railway and other funds of the Colony during the year ending on the 31st December, 1955, any sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of two million nine hundred and fifty-seven thousand nine hundred and sixty-one dollars set forth in the Second Schedule to this Ordinance: Provided that any balance of such sum unissued at the end of December of that year may be utilised before the accounts of the said period are closed for the discharge of any liability incurred during the said period.

5. The General Manager, Port Services Department, may, on the warrant of the Governor, pay out of the revenue of the Port Services Department and other funds of the Colony during the year ending on the 31st December, 1955, any sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of six million three hundred and eighty-seven thousand six hundred and sixty-three dollars set forth in the Third Schedule to this Ordinance: Provided that any balance of such sum unissued at the end of December of that year may be utilised before the accounts of the said period are closed for the discharge of any liability incurred during the said period.
