AN ORDINANCE to make special provision for the grant of an annual allowance to the widow and infant children of the late Albert Alfred Douglas, formerly Assistant Controller of Imports and Exports.

Enactment

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Douglas (Special Allowance) Ordinance, 1952.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in any law relating to the grant of pensions, gratuities or other allowances, there may be paid from general revenue to the widow of the late Albert Alfred Douglas, formerly Assistant Controller of Imports and Exports, while unmarried a monthly allowance at the rate of six hundred dollars per annum: Provided that if the said widow dies unmarried leaving a child or children of the said Albert Alfred Douglas who is or are under the age of eighteen years, there may be paid from general revenue to the guardian of such child or children a monthly allowance at the rate of three hundred dollars per annum in respect of each such child until such child attains the age of eighteen years or, if a female child, marries under the age of eighteen years.

Authority to pay special allowance to the dependants of the late Albert Alfred Douglas.

Passed in Council this fourteenth day of March, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-two.
