AN ORDINANCE to provide for the incorporation of a body to be known as the Incorporated Trustees of the New Testament Church of God in the Colony.

Commencement.

WHEREAS there has been established in the Colony a religious Organization known as The New Testament Church of God (hereinafter called "the Organization") which is an integral part of the Church of God—the parent body with its international headquarters at 922, 930, 1080 Montgomery Avenue in Cleveland, in the State of Tennessee, in the United States of America:

Preamble.

And Whereas the Reverend Edward Dickson Hasmatali of the Town of San Fernando has been superintending the activities of the Organization in the Colony:

And Whereas the Organization is desirous of being incorporated in the Colony and Paul Haven Walker of No. 1080 Montgomery Avenue, Cleveland, in Tennessee, U.S.A., Aaron Wilson Brummett of 2818, S.W. 77 Avenue, Miami, 55, U.S.A., the said Edward Dickson Hasmatali, Wilson Simon Ramai of Ben Lomond, Naparima, and Samuel Mathura of Montrose, Chaguanas, in this Colony have been asked and are willing to serve as trustees of and to hold property for any of the uses or purposes of the Organization in the Colony:

And Whereas it is expedient that the Trustees for the time being should be incorporated and should have power to hold lands and other property in trust for the Organization:

Enactment. Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title. **1.** This Ordinance may be cited as The New Testament Church of God Incorporation Ordinance, 1960.

Incorporation of Trustees. **2.** The said Paul Haven Walker, Aaron Wilson Brummett, Edward Dickson Hasmatali, Wilson Simon Ramai and Samuel Mathura, and their successors in office as trustees of The New Testament Church of God shall be and are hereby created a body corporate by the name of "The Incorporated Trustees of The New Testament Church of God" (hereinafter called "the Trustees") and by that name shall have perpetual succession and also by that name shall and may sue and be sued in all Courts of Justice in the Colony and shall have and use a Common Seal which may from time to time be changed, altered or made anew.

Trustees may acquire property. **3.** The Trustees shall, have full power to acquire for the Organization by purchase, transfer, exchange, devise, demise, grant, gift, bequest, or otherwise, all lands or other property of what nature or kind soever in perpetuity or for a life or lives or for any term of years, and also any money, securities for money, goods or chattels whatsoever; and to take, hold and enjoy the same, and subject also to the performance of any trust upon which the said lands or other property, money, securities for money, goods or chattels may have been acquired.

4. It shall be lawful for the Trustees, subject to the performance of any trust as aforesaid, from time to time by deed under their seal to sell or demise, grant, convey, transfer, exchange, surrender or otherwise dispose of any lands or other property vested or which may hereafter be vested in them.

Trustees may dispose of property.

5. It shall be lawful for the Trustees subject to the performance of any trust as aforesaid, to borrow money, and, for the repayment of the same, by deed under their seal to give and execute mortgages, charges, pledges or other securities of their real or personal property or to make any such arrangements as they may consider expedient, with such covenants, powers and provisions as they may think proper.

Trustees may borrow money and give mortgages.

6. All deeds, and other documents requiring the seal of the Trustees shall be sealed with the common seal of the Trustees in the presence of at least three of the Trustees who shall sign every such deed or other document to which the common seal is affixed and such signing shall be prima facie evidence that the said seal was duly and properly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of The Trustees.

Execution of deeds, &c.

7. The Incorporated Trustees shall at all times have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on them and such address shall be registered with the Registrar General. All documents to be served on the Incorporated Trustees may be served by leaving the same at, or sending the same by registered post to the address so registered.

Address for service.

8. Nothing in this Ordinance shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of Her Majesty, Her Heirs and successors, or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any other persons except such as are mentioned in this Ordinance and those claiming by, from or under them.

Saving of Crown or other rights.

Passed in Council this eighteenth day of March, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty.
