AN ORDINANCE for the incorporation of certain persons as Trustees of The Petroleum Association of Trinidad.

[11th July, 1957.]

Commence-
ment.

WHEREAS there has been established in the Colony an Association known as The Petroleum Association of Trinidad (hereinafter called "the Association").

And Whereas the Association is desirous that Patrick Carrington Hobson of Sunset Drive, Bayshore, in the Ward of Diego Martin, in the Island of Trinidad the President of the Association, George Lowe Reid of Point Fortin in the said Island of Trinidad the Vice-President of the Association, and Arthur Roland Gill of Simeon Road, Diego Martin in the said

Island of Trinidad the Secretary of the Association and their successors in office respectively be formed into a body corporate.

And Whereas it is expedient that the said Patrick Carrington Hobson, George Lowe Reid and Arthur Roland Gill and their successors in office respectively should be incorporated.

Be it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as The Petroleum Association of Trinidad (Incorporation) Ordinance, 1957.

Incorporation of Trustees.

2. The said Patrick Carrington Hobson, the President, George Lowe Reid, the Vice-President and Arthur Roland Gill, the Secretary, as aforesaid, and their successors in office as President, Vice-President and Secretary respectively of the Association shall be and are hereby created a body corporate by the name of "The Incorporated Trustees of The Petroleum Association of Trinidad" (hereinafter called "The Incorporated Trustees") and by such name shall have perpetual succession, and may sue and be sued in all Courts of Justice in the Colony, and shall have and use a common seal, which may from time to time be changed: Provided that no such change shall be made except by a resolution of the Association.

Trustees may acquire property.

3. The Incorporated Trustees shall, subject to the rules, regulations and control of the Association, have full power to acquire for the Association by purchase, transfer, exchange, demise, gift, bequest, conveyance or otherwise, any real or personal property in the Colony or any estate or interest therein, and subject to such rules and regulations and control as aforesaid, to take hold and enjoy the same, and subject also to the performance of any trust upon which the said real or personal property may have been acquired.

Trustees may dispose of property.

4. It shall be lawful for The Incorporated Trustees subject to such rules, regulations and control as aforesaid, from time to time by deed under their seal to sell or demise, grant, convey, exchange or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may for the time being be vested in or have been acquired by them.

5. It shall be lawful for the Incorporated Trustees subject to such rules, regulations and control as aforesaid, by deed under their seal to enter into any agreement on behalf of the Association for the establishment of a Provident Fund for the benefit of employees of the Association.

6. Nothing in this Ordinance shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of Her Majesty or of any bodies politic or corporate or any other persons, except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Ordinance and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
