TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

Act No. 2 of 1965

AN ACT to provide for the service of Trinidad and Tobago
for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1965

[Assented to 29th January, 1965]

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, Enactment
by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and
House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and
by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act, 1965. Short title

2. The issue from the Consolidated Fund of the sum of Two hundred and seventy-one million, one hundred and fifty-two thousand, nine hundred and seventeen dollars is hereby authorised for meeting expenditure for the service of the year ending 31st December, 1965, under the heads of expenditure specified in the Schedule; and the sum specified in the said Schedule opposite to a head is hereby appropriated out of the said sum of Two hundred and seventy-one million, one hundred and fifty-two thousand, nine hundred and seventeen dollars for the purposes specified in relation to that head in the Estimates for the said year.

3. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Exchequer and Audit Ordinance, 1959, any balance of the sum appropriated by this Act in respect of Head 29—Railways and unissued at the 31st day of December, 1965 may be utilised, before the accounts of the Railway in respect of the year 1965 are closed, for the discharge of any liability incurred during the said year under that Head.
