TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

Act No. 25 of 1966

AN ACT for the Incorporation of the Taxi Operators
Association of Trinidad and Tobago.

[Assented to 24th August, 1966]

WHEREAS there has been established in Trinidad and Tobago an Association known as "The Taxi Operators Association of Trinidad and Tobago".

Preamble

And whereas it is expedient that the said Association should be incorporated for the purpose of exercising the powers hereinafter set forth :

Enactment	BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the authority of the same as follows:—
Short title	1. This Act may be cited as the Taxi Operators Association of Trinidad and Tobago Act, 1966.
Incorporation	2. The Association known as the "Taxi Operators Association of Trinidad and Tobago" shall be and is hereby created a body corporate and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and may sue and be sued in all courts of Justice in the Territory by that name, and shall have and use a common seal with power from time to time to change such seal.
Vesting of property	3. All property shall be vested in the name of the "Taxi Operators Association of Trinidad and Tobago".
Powers of the Corporation	4. The corporate body hereby created shall have power— <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) to acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, demise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance or howsoever otherwise; any real or personal property or any estate or interest therein; (b) to accept surrenders or re-conveyances and to enter into contracts; (c) subject to any restraints, reservation or condition contained in the document under which it shall have acquired title thereto, to sell, demise, mortgage, or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may for the time being be vested in or have been acquired by it.
Mode of execution of documents	5. All documents requiring the seal of the said corporate body shall be sealed with the common seal in the presence of its President and Secretary for the time being in office who shall both sign every such document, and such signing shall be <i>prima facie</i> evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the corporation.

6. The said corporate body shall at all times have a fixed address for the service of documents on the corporation and such address shall be registered with the Registrar General. All documents to be served on the corporation may be served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to, the address so registered.

Service of documents on the Corporation

7. Nothing in this Act shall affect the rights of Her Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any other persons except such claiming, by, through, from or under them.
