AN ORDINANCE to provide for the Incorporation of a Body Commencement.  
to be known as the Incorporated Trustees of the Improved,  
Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the World in  
Trinidad and Tobago.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as The Improved, Benevo- Short title.  
lent, Protective Order of Elks of the World Incorporation  
Ordinance, 1961.

Incorporation  
of Trustees.

2. Claudius Fitzgerald Clunes, Grand District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler, Walter Clarke, Exalted Ruler, Roderick Duncan, the Immediate Past Exalted Ruler, Thomas Hernandez, Past Exalted Ruler, Steadman Victor Jeffers, Legal Officer and Joseph Egerton Felix, Secretary, shall be and are hereby created a body corporate by the name of "The Incorporated Trustees of the Improved, Benevolent, Protective Order of Elks of the World in Trinidad and Tobago" (hereinafter called "the Trustees") and by that name shall have perpetual succession and also by that name may sue and be sued and shall have a common seal with power to change such seal.

Vesting of  
property.

3. All property now vested in Hekel Lodge, No. 1487 on the Register of the Grand Lodge of the Improved, Benevolent, Protective Order of Elks of the World and all buildings and lands now vested in any person and appropriated to the uses of the Improved, Benevolent, Protective Order of Elks of the World in Trinidad and Tobago are hereby transferred to and vested in the Trustees.

Trustees may  
acquire  
property.

4. Subject to the rules, regulations and control of the Lodge Council in the Territory of Trinidad and Tobago, the Trustees shall have full power to acquire for the Improved, Benevolent, Protective Order of Elks of the World in this Territory by gift, grant, purchase, devise or otherwise any lands, buildings, messuages and hereditaments of what nature or kind whatsoever in perpetuity or for a life or lives or for a term of years, and also any moneys, goods and chattels and subject to such rules and trusts upon which the said lands, may have been acquired, to take, hold and enjoy the same.

Trustees may  
dispose of  
property.

5. Subject to the rules, regulations and control aforesaid and to the performance of any such trusts as aforesaid, and except as hereinafter provided, the Trustees may sell, demise, grant, convey, transfer, alienate or otherwise dispose of any property by this Ordinance vested in them, or which may hereafter be acquired by or become vested in them.

Mode of  
execution of  
documents.

6. All documents requiring the seal of the Trustees shall be sealed with the Common Seal of the Trustees in the presence of two of the Trustees who shall sign every such document, and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said Seal was duly affixed and that it is the lawful seal of the Trustees.

7. (1) The Trustees shall at all times have a fixed address for the service of documents on the Trustees and such address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General.

Service of  
documents on  
Corporation.

(2) Any document may be served on the Trustees by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to the address as registered under subsection (1) of this section.

8. Nothing in this Ordinance shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any other persons, except such as are mentioned in this Ordinance and those claiming by, from, or under them.

Saving of  
Crown and  
other rights.
