AN ORDINANCE to repeal and replace the Roman Catholic  
Archbishop Incorporation Ordinance.

Commence-  
ment.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as The Roman Catholic Archbishop Incorporation Ordinance, 1960. Short title.

2. In this Ordinance—

“the Corporation” means the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Port-of-Spain;

“the Territory” means the Colony of Trinidad and Tobago.

Incorporation.

3. His Excellency The Most Reverend Count Finbar Ryan, the Roman Catholic Archbishop in the Territory and his successors in office, or the Roman Catholic dignitary for the time being having the supreme ecclesiastical jurisdiction in the said Territory in the Roman Catholic Church, shall be a body corporate and have the name “The Roman Catholic Archbishop of Port-of-Spain”, and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and may sue and be sued in all Courts of Justice in the said Territory and shall have and use a common seal, which may from time to time be changed.

Acquisition of property.

4. The Corporation may acquire for the said body corporate by purchase, transfer, assignment, exchange, donation, demise, gift, bequest or otherwise real and personal property in the Territory or any estate or interest therein and also any money, securities for money, goods or chattels whatsoever and to take, hold and enjoy the same.

Disposition of property.

5. The Corporation may from time to time by deed under seal sell, demise, grant, convey, transfer, assign, exchange or otherwise dispose of any lands or other property which shall or may for the time being be or become vested in or which may hereafter be acquired or vested in the body corporate as aforesaid.

Power to borrow money and give mortgages and other securities.

6. The Corporation may from time to time borrow money and for the repayment of same by deed under seal give and execute mortgages, charges, pledges or other securities of real or personal property of the body corporate or make any such arrangements as the body corporate may consider expedient, with such covenants, powers and provisions as the body corporate may think proper.

Registration of address for service of documents and manner of service.

7. (1) The Corporation shall at all times have a fixed address for the service of documents on the Corporation and such address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General.

(2) Any document may be served on the Corporation by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to the address as registered under subsection (1) of this section.

8. Nothing in this Ordinance shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of Her Majesty or of any bodies politic or corporate or any other persons, except such as are mentioned in this Ordinance and those claiming by, from, or under them. Saving of Crown and other rights.

9. The Roman Catholic Archbishop Incorporation Ordinance is hereby repealed. Repeal. Cap. 301 of 1925.
