AN ORDINANCE for the Incorporation of the Trinidad and Tobago Association for Retarded Children.

[13th July, 1961.]

WHEREAS there has been established in the Territory an association known as the Trinidad and Tobago Association for Retarded Children. Preamble.

And whereas it is expedient that the said Association should be incorporated for the purpose of exercising the powers hereinafter set forth:

- Enactment** Be it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—
- Short title.** 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Trinidad and Tobago Association for Retarded Children, 1961.
- Incorporation.** 2. The association known as "The Trinidad and Tobago Association for Retarded Children" shall be and is hereby created a body corporate and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and may sue and be sued in the courts of justice in the Territory by that name, and shall have and shall use a common seal which may from time to time be changed in accordance with the rules of the said body corporate. The said body corporate is hereinafter referred to in this Ordinance as "the said Association".
- Powers of the Association.** 3. The said Association shall have power:—
- (a) to acquire by purchase, exchange, gift, bequest, devise or otherwise, all messuages, land, tenements and hereditaments of any tenure and also all moneys, securities for money, goods or chattels whatsoever, and may hold and enjoy the same;
 - (b) to accept surrenders and re-conveyances and to enter into contracts;
 - (c) to sell, demise, grant, convey, mortgage, re-convey, surrender, exchange or otherwise dispose of all or any property from time to time vested in it.
- Mode of execution of documents.** 4. All documents requiring the seal of the said Association shall be sealed with its common seal in the presence of the President, or if the President is not available, a member of the Executive Committee of the said Association nominated by the said Executive Committee for the purpose, and the Secretary who shall both sign every such document and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and the same is the lawful seal of the Association.
- Service of documents on Association.** 5. The said Association shall at all times have a permanent address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on the said Association and such address shall be registered with the Registrar General. All documents to be served on the said Association may be served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to, the address so registered.

6. The Association may make rules for the proper conduct Rules.
for its proceedings and discharge of its duties.

7. Nothing in this Ordinance shall affect or be deemed to Saving of
Crown and
other rights.
affect the rights of Her Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors, or
of any bodies politic or corporate or of any other persons except
such as are mentioned in this Ordinance and those claiming by,
from or under them.
