AN ACT to provide for the service of Trinidad and Tobago  
for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1963.

BE IT ENACTED by The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by **Enactment**  
and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House  
of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the  
authority of the same, as follows:—

- 1.** This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act, 1963. **Short title**

2. A sum not exceeding Two hundred and forty-one million, nine hundred and ninety-one thousand, and eleven dollars shall be and the same is hereby charged upon the Consolidated Fund for the service of the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1963.

3. The sum charged by Section 2 of this Act is hereby appropriated for the services and purposes expressed in the Schedule to this Act, and shall be deemed to have been so appropriated from the 1st day of January, 1963.

4. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Exchequer and Audit Ordinance, 1959, any balance of the sum appropriated by this Act in respect of the Railway and unissued at the 31st day of December, 1963 may be utilised before the accounts of the Railway, in respect of the year 1963 are closed for the discharge of any liability incurred during the said year.
