AN ACT for the Incorporation of the Governing Body of
Trinity College

[Assented to 3rd July, 1963]

WHEREAS there has been established in the Territory a Preamble
Body known as "The Governing Body of Trinity College":

And Whereas it is expedient that the said body should
be incorporated for the purpose of exercising the powers
hereinafter set forth:

Enactment	BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—
Short title	1. This Act may be cited as the Governing Body of Trinity College Incorporation Act, 1963.
Incorporation	2. The body known as "The Governing Body of Trinity College" (hereinafter called "the Association") shall be and is hereby created a body corporate and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and may sue and be sued in all Courts of Justice in the Territory by that name, and shall have and use a common seal with power from time to time to change such seal.
Function	3. The functions of the Association shall be— (a) to establish junior and secondary schools for the education and boarding of boys, and (b) to provide playgrounds.
Powers of Association	4. The Association shall have power from time to time— (a) To acquire by purchase, exchange, demise, gift, bequest, conveyance, or howsoever otherwise, any real or personal property or any estate or interest therein and also any money, securities for money, goods or chattels whatsoever; (b) By deed under its seal to sell, demise, grant, convey, exchange, surrender or otherwise dispose of any property vested or which may be hereafter vested in it; (c) To borrow money and for the repayment of the same by deed under its seal to give and execute mortgages, charges, pledges or other securities of its real and personal property or to make any such arrangements as it may consider expedient with such covenants, powers and provisions as it may think fit.
Mode of Execution of Documents	5. All documents requiring the seal of the Association shall be executed with its common seal in the presence of its Chairman and Secretary for the time being in office who shall both sign every such document, and such signing shall be <i>prima facie</i> evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the Association.

6. The Association shall at all times have a fixed address for the service of documents on the Association and such address shall be registered with the Registrar General. All documents to be served on the Association may be served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to the address so registered.

7. The Association may make rules for the proper conduct of its proceedings and discharge of its duties and any of such rules may be varied or revoked or added to by the Association.

Rules

8. The provisions of the Interpretation Act, 1962 shall as far as possible apply in the construction of this Act and of every section thereof. And, without prejudice to the generality of what is herebefore enacted in this section of this Act, but subject, nevertheless, to the express provisions of this Act and to the constitution of the Association and to any rules, regulations and bye-laws made and resolutions passed thereunder, it is more particularly hereby provided that nothing enacted in sections 2, 3, 4 and 5 of this Act shall in any way derogate from Section 19 of the said Interpretation Act, 1962.

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9. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of Her Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors, or of any bodies public or corporate or of any other persons, except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
