TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO
Act No. 32 of 1970

AN ACT for the Incorporation of the Junior Chamber of
Trinidad and Tobago, and for matters incidental thereto.

[Assented to 16th September, 1970]

WHEREAS for many years there has been established in
Trinidad and Tobago a leadership training Organisation
known as the Junior Chamber of Trinidad and Tobago.

And whereas it is expedient that the said association
should be incorporated under the name of Junior Chamber
of Trinidad and Tobago,

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the authority of the same as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the Junior Chamber of Trinidad and Tobago (Incorporation) Act, 1970.

2. The Association known as the Junior Chamber of Trinidad and Tobago shall be and is hereby created a body corporate and by that name shall have perpetual succession and may sue, and be sued in all courts of Justice in Trinidad and Tobago by that name and shall have and use a common seal with power from time to time to change such seal.

3. The corporate body hereby created shall have power

- (a) to acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, demise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance or howsoever otherwise, any real or personal property or any estate or interest therein;
- (b) to accept surrenders or re-conveyances and to enter into contracts;
- (c) subject to any restraint, reservation or condition contained in the document under which it shall have acquired title thereto, to sell, exchange, demise, mortgage, or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may for the time being be vested in or have been acquired by it.

4. All property shall be vested in the name of The Junior Chamber of Trinidad and Tobago.

5. All documents requiring the seal of the said corporate body shall be sealed with the common seal in the presence of at least two Officers of the Association who shall both sign every such document and such signing shall be prima facie evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the corporate body.

6. The said corporate body shall at all times have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on the corporate body and such address shall be

registered with the Registrar General. All documents to be served on the corporate body may be served by leaving same at, or by sending the same by registered post to, the address so registered.

7. Nothing in this Act shall affect the rights of Her Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors or any bodies politic or corporate or of any other persons except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
